SDGs on Campus

Time: 30 - 40 minutes

Teams: 3 - 6 players

Location: Anywhere on campus where SDG-related initiatives can be observed

The Story

Your campus is full of initiatives, services, and spaces that support the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). From recycling points to well-being campaigns, green mobility, accessibility services, and research tackling global challenges - many university actions contribute to a more sustainable world. Yet these efforts often go unnoticed.

Your mission: explore the campus to discover how many SDG connections you can identify and highlight how everyday university activities support global sustainability.

Help make your campus's sustainability efforts visible, valued, and celebrated.

Mission Tasks

Step 1: Explore the Campus (15 minutes)

Walk through different parts of the campus and look for visible sustainability-related examples such as recycling stations, water-saving systems, bike racks, green areas, equality campaigns, health initiatives, inclusive services, and research or innovation spaces that address global challenges.

Take notes or photos of what you find.

Step 2: Match Your Observations to SDGs (5 minutes)

Discuss which SDG(s) each example supports. Identify whether the initiative links to multiple goals and consider how it impacts the environment, students, or the wider community.

Aim to build a diverse list that touches several SDG themes.

Step 3: Present Your Findings (5 minutes)

Choose your three strongest examples and present them to the moderator.

Explain what the initiative is, which SDGs it links to, and how it contributes to sustainability on campus.

Step 4: How Can YOU Get Involved? (5 minutes)

Discuss as a team how students can actively support or participate in the initiatives you identified. Think about small, realistic steps you could take - your involvement can help strengthen the university's contributions to the SDGs.
